





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"Go big or go home" might have been one man's motivation for building a massive igloo beside a lonely stretch of Alaskan highway. The three-story structure, with its urethane-coated, plywood exterior was built in the 1970s by a man named Leon Smith, whose dream was to create a hotel and resort called Igloo City.

Unfortunately, the ill-conceived igloo failed to meet building codes and never opened for business, as Smith had run out of funds to bring it up to standard. Since then, the building has passed through a succession of owners and developers as it sat vacant and deteriorating. Recently, a new lessee unveiled plans to open a distillery there, hoping to break the curse of the ignoble igloo.

## Mississippi Blues Trail Tunica, MS

The Mississippi Delta is widely known as the birthplace of the blues. And U.S. Highway 61,called the "Blues Highway," runs 200 miles through the heart of the region. Blues legends like Muddy Waters, Robert Johnson, John Lee Hooker, and many others were born or lived near U.S. 61 at one time or another. Additionally, the highway served as a main artery for blues musicians heading north to perform in cities like Chicago and St. Louis.

The Gateway to the Blues Museum and Visitors Center in Tunica is a great place to learn some blues history, and its restored 1890s train depot makes for the perfect photo opp (the visitors center and gift shop is free to visit; entry fee applies to the museum).



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# Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument Crow Agency, MT

History often isn't pretty, and the Battle of Little Bighorn, often referred to as Custer's Last Stand, represents a particularly dark time in our country's history. June of 1876, at the height of the effort intended to force Native Americans off their ancestral lands and onto reservations.

More than 260 federal troops led by General George Armstrong Custer perished in the fight, with Lakota, Northern Cheyenne, and Arapaho tribes also tragically losing many warriors.

# Loneliest Road in America Fallon to Ely, NV

You just might find yourself singing "Only the Lonely" (Roy Orbison's 1960 classic) as you ride U.S. 50 through the middle of Nevada's high desert. Dubbed "The Loneliest Road in America" by Life magazine in 1986, the highway is particularly lonely along its 250 mile stretch between Fallon and Ely, where traffic is sparse and towns and gas stations are few and far between.

In its article, Life magazine claimed, "There are no points of interest. We don't recommend it," adding, "We warn all motorists not to drive there unless they're confident of their survival skills." While those claims may be exaggerated, it is advisable to start with a full tank and gas up whenever you can.

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## Woodstock Monument Swan Lake, NY

"By the time we got to Woodstock, we were half a million strong..." sang Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young in 1970. The Woodstock Music and Arts Fair, billed as "Three Days of Peace and Music," took place in August of 1969 on a 600-acre dairy farm owned by a man named Max Yasgur. Thirty-two musical acts performed, wrapped up with a searing performance by Jimi Hendrix, whose unique rendition of "The Star-Spangled Banner" became emblematic of the counter-cultural movement.

Despite its name, the event occurred in Bethel, NY, about 60 miles southwest of Woodstock. The festival site was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2017. Today the Bethel Woods Center for the Arts is located there; its museum offers an in-depth look at the festival and culture of the 60s.

# Hells Canyon Scenic Byway LaGrande to Baker City, OR

From the depths of Hells Canyon to the peaks of the Wallowa Mountains, Hells Canyon Scenic Byway runs 218 miles in a horseshoe-shaped loop between La Grande and Baker City, Oregon. Located in the northeast corner of Oregon, the All-American Road meanders past rolling farmland, rugged cliffs, fertile valleys, snow-kissed mountains, and of course Hells Canyon, the deepest river gorge in the U.S.

The entire route is paved, but you may encounter long stretches without services, so be prepared with a full tank of gas. Also, the road is usually closed due to snow from late October through late May or early June.

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# Fighting Seabee Statue North Kingstown, RI

The U.S. Naval Construction Battalion, better known as the Seabees, is represented by a fierce bumblebee wearing a sailor's cap and brandishing a pipe wrench, hammer, and machine gun. The mascot represents the Seabees "Can Do" mission and was designed in 1942by Frank lafrate, a 22-year-old civilian file clerk at the Quonset Point Naval Air Station in Davisville, RI.

The Fighting Seabee statue, constructed in 1971, originally sat at the entrance gate to the Naval Air Station. The base was decommissioned in 1974, and in 1999 the statue was moved to its current location on the grounds of the nearby Seabees Museum and Memorial Park.







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# Dignity of Earth and Sky

High on a bluff overlooking the Missouri River, Dignity of Earth and Sky is a 50-foot-tall stainless steel sculpture of a Native American woman. Her outstretched arms hold a star quilt featuring 128 diamond-shaped pieces designed to flutter in the wind. Created by South Dakota artist Dale Lamphere, the imposing monument honors the Native Nations of the Great Plains.

"Dignity represents the courage, perseverance and wisdom of the Lakota and Dakota culture in South Dakota," Lamphere has said. "My hope is that the sculpture might serve as a symbol of respect and promise for the future."



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# International Boundary Marker, Republic of Texas Carthage, TX

The phrase "It's like a whole other country" has often been used to describe Texas. Well, between 1836 and 1846, Texas actually was another country, known as the Republic of Texas. In 1841, survey crews placed a series of posts along the international border. Engraved "R.T." (for Republic of Texas) on its west side, and "U.S." on the east, this granite post in Carthage, TX is the sole remaining of the original markers.

This "blink and you'll miss it" location sits at the Texas/Louisiana state line. Riding west from Louisiana on LA State Route 765, look for the "Panola County Line" sign as you cross into Texas on Farm to Market Road 31 (FM-31). Immediately after that sign, the site will be on your right, just off the road, adjacent to a small gravel parking area. A metal fence surrounds the original granite marker.

Note: The International Boundary Marker is part of the suggested route for the 2024 Texas Independence H.O.G. Touring Rally.
