I was born and raised in Wisconsin, learned how to drive on a frozen lake after my dad got done racing. He used to Pro Rally and ice race. Because of him, I have always enjoyed cars, racing, sports (football), etc. My brother Jeff is my only sibling and is 7 years older than me, living in OH.

After the “crash” of 2008, I moved to Arizona and made a new life out here; Labor Day 2009, to be exact. There was a short stint between 2013 and 2016 when I moved back to WI, but realized I wanted to go back to AZ.

Had it not been for that move, I never would have met Steve, as we were introduced by the woman who replaced me at the company I was working for (he worked with her husband). When I came back in 2016, I was able to go back to the same company, and she was still there.

Prior to learning how to ride, I was a backpack for many years. While riding on the back of Steve’s Street Glide, I was falling asleep due to “boredom”, lol. Riding Through It All: The Journey of Eric Bushamie

At RoadRunner and Arrowhead Harley-Davidson, few names carry the weight and respect that Eric Bushamie does.

A steady presence, a leader by example, and someone who truly lives the Harley-Davidson lifestyle—Eric's story is not just about motorcycles, but about family, teamwork, perseverance, and passion for the ride.

From Military Service to Motorcycle Sales

Eric's path to Harley-Davidson began far from the showroom floor. After serving eight years in the military and being stationed at Luke Air Force Base, Eric transitioned to civilian life, bringing with him a work ethic forged in discipline and dedication.

In 1997, he joined the motorcycle industry part-time, balancing military service and the challenges of post-service life.

"Young Vets just didn't get paid enough money at that time," reflecting on his early days while working with import brands like Honda and Sea-Doo.

By 2004, his talent and experience made him a natural fit for Sales Manager at Arrowhead Harley-Davidson. The mid-2000s were a wild time in the industry—booming sales, high energy, and a "gangbuster" market. But Eric's journey wasn't without challenges. When the 2007 downturn hit, he leaned on his core values: commitment to family, staying grounded, and loyalty to the brand.

Leadership in Action

In April 2010, Eric stepped into the role of General Manager, a position he's held with pride ever since. Through the highs and lows—from economic downturns to COVID supply chain struggles—he's remained the calm at the center of the storm.

"Every day starts with a temperature check," Eric says.

"Not just the literal weather—but the tone of the team. Is everyone dialed in? Are we ready to give customers the best experience? They are our priority?"



He's more than a manager—he's a coach, a motivator, a problem-solver. He's been asked how he keeps calm when the phone doesn't stop ringing night and day, and his answer is simple:

"I chose to be here. Twenty-six years later... I still love what I do."

More Than Just a Job

Eric's life is deeply tied to motorcycles—but it's also tied to family.

He met his wife in 1990, and they raised two sons who became riders themselves.

At one point, the Bushamie garage held 11 bikes.





In 2016, Eric became a partner in both Arrowhead and RoadRunner Harley-Davidson—a testament to his leadership and dedication. Though the dealerships were eventually sold to a public company, Eric continues to manage both locations, taking on the enormous challenge of dual leadership.

"It's the most rewarding thing—watching someone grow from a junior staffer to a department manager. Helping people build careers doing something they love—that's the good stuff," he shares. But he's honest about the pressure. "Running one store is overwhelming. Two is... well, you eat healthy, go to bed early, and your only personal time is between 4:00 am to 6:30am."

The RoadRunner dealership was a special project. Eric was involved from the ground up, helping design and build it with future expansion in mind. Everything—from the parking lot to plumbing, lighting, and storage—was laid out for a dealership that's destined to double in size. Getting it built, however, wasn't easy. Eric had to fight city zoning boards, advocate for Harley's standards, and even go to bat for a 65-foot bar and shield flagpole—a non-negotiable symbol of the Harley brand.



A Chapter for the Riders

Eric is just as passionate about the RoadRunner HOG chapter.

His vision? Keep it simple: low drama, safe rides, and fun.

"If you're not here for that," he says plainly, "go find something else to do."

He envisions a bright future for the chapter, aiming to grow its membership to 300 while increasing its visibility through local and regional events—efforts he believes will boost the chapter's reputation in the riding community.

Looking Ahead

So what's next? Growth, always.

Eric and his team are patiently waiting for the right time to expand RoadRunner, a plan that's already been laid in steel and concrete. But until then, Eric remains focused on what matters: his team, his riders, and the experience they deliver every day.

For Eric Bushamie, it's never been just about selling motorcycles.

It's about the great people who ride them—and making sure every mile, every moment, and every memory is worth it.

GOING FULL THROTTLE: RON LONG'S PASSION FOR THE RIDE FROM OPEN ROADS TO HOG CHAPTER SUCCESS

Ron Long has been riding Harley-Davidson motorcycles since 1991 — that's nearly 35 years and over 110,000 miles of fast rides, and open roads.

When he started thinking about his next job before easing into retirement, Ron found himself drawn to a new opportunity: joining the sales team at Arrowhead Harley-Davidson. It turned out to be a great fit. Not long after, on July 1, 2021, Ron added another role—HOG Chapter Manager for Arrowhead — stepping into the position after longtime manager Bill Brown retired.

In his new role as the liaison between the dealership and the chapter, Ron set out with a clear goal: to grow the membership and bring the chapter back to life with fun, ride-oriented events, all while keeping up his work in sales. "It's not work if you enjoy your job!" Ron says with a grin.

And clearly, something clicked. Starting with just 80 members, the chapter grew to 280 riders in his first year.

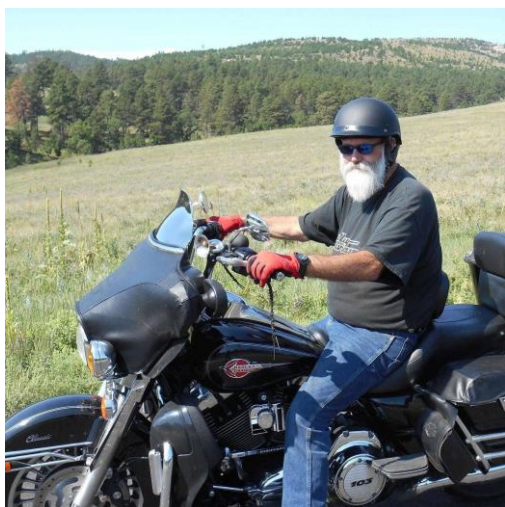


By May 2024, Ron had also stepped up to manage the RoadRunner Harley-Davidson Chapter. Balancing two chapters has its challenges, but Ron thrives on it. He's proud of how both groups have grown into active, welcoming communities led by dedicated volunteers. Looking ahead, especially at RoadRunner's future, Ron hopes to see even more events on the calendar—and maybe even see the dealership become a must-visit, destination stop on the official HOG map. With the perfect location next to I-10 and strong support from the team, he's optimistic.

When Ron thinks back on his favorite rides, two stand out. First is the White Mountain Rally—perfectly organized and packed with jaw-dropping mountain views. Closer to home, he loves cruising through the desert to Rio Verde and Scottsdale, with a final stop at Phil's Filling Stn Grill in Fountain Hills, AZ—a '50s-style diner with a huge menu and walls full of nostalgic memorabilia. Ron had just begun explaining the importance of building relationships when his phone rang. Without missing a beat, he flashed a grin, flipped the switch to full salesman mode, and focused all his attention on the caller.

Ride Opportunities

The **My Arizona Map** “*Tour of Duty Ride*” for **MAM** ~ short for Military Assistance Mission. MAM provides financial assistance and morale aid to struggling Arizona active duty, guard & reserve military service members and their families.

The “Map” itself costs \$10 to purchase, which helps support MAM’s mission and the 69 participating Arizona businesses identified on the map (any of which you can purchase the map from). The idea is to visit as many stops as you want/are able, make a purchase of some kind (however small!), and receive a stamp on your map that, for every 6 “stamp stops,” you’ll receive one entry into a cash drawing ... 1st place is \$1,000, 2nd place is \$400, 3rd place is \$300, 4th place is \$200 and 5th place is \$100.

The drawing is held the following January, and stamped maps must be submitted to MAM no later than Nov. 20th, 2026. Remember: you don’t have to visit ALL 69 locations; you only need to visit 6 (or any multiple of 6), to qualify for an entry to win; but the more stops you make, the better your chances of winning! And if you **DO** visit all 69 stops, that enters you into a separate Grand Prize drawing for \$1,000.

RIDES AND EVENTS SCHEDULE

- All rides are weather permitting
- Non-Chapter members and all minors must complete a waiver form before the ride begins
- Chapter activities are conducted primarily for the benefit of Roadrunner H.O.G. chapter members

There are three categories of activities for Roadrunner H.O.G.; all activities are identified as follows:

Closed Events: open only to RoadRunner H.O.G. members and a guest

HOG Member Events: open to any national H.O.G. member

Open Events: Open to chapter members, national H.O.G. members and other guests

All RoadRunner activities are closed events unless otherwise stated.

Group riding requires a commitment by all individual riders to ride within their own skill level while contributing to the safety of all. This means that if you are not comfortable riding at the group's pace, it is important to move toward the front of the group (behind the Shotgun and Lead riders) so they can properly and safely adjust the pace and still keep the group together.

If a rider begins to split the group by riding more slowly, or "pushes" the rider in front of him/her by riding faster than the group, safety can become jeopardized. If you are concerned about how the group rides, please talk with a Road Captain to gain feedback on the best way to ride in a compatible manner. If the group is separated and the Lead can no longer maintain visual contact with the Sweep riders, the safety of others becomes threatened. We want everyone to have fun, feel comfortable & experience a safe ride.

How to Use TeamUp

To use TeamUp, you go to teamup.com on your computer or get the TeamUp Calendar app. When you have done this, you will create an account. On the computer it will ask you to confirm your email address and when it does it will ask you to login. Now it will say create a new calendar or existing one. Select an existing one and on the next page enter this link: <https://teamup.com/ksk8dhsnrrkemvyqjq>

On a cell phone you add the App. If you have not already created an account, you will do it now. If you did or finished creating your account login, it will say “create a calendar” in larger print, but below it in smaller print it will say “open existing account”. Click on Open existing account and add the following link: <https://teamup.com/ksk8dhsnrrkemvyqjq>

When you have done this, you should now see **Roadrunner H.O.G. #5112** on your screen. From now on, any ride that we add to this calendar should show up in about 2 minutes if your devices are turned on.

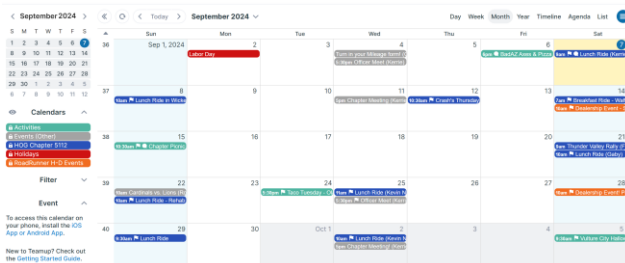
